

Articulation Policy for Accredited Business Module - Department of Business Management

Credit-Bearing Module

The Certified Rescue Analysis Programme: Business module, may earn credits towards the OBS821 module in the MPhil (IBR) programme

General Conditions for Articulation

MPhil (IBR) Program Specifics

- The MPhil (IBR) programme requires a minimum of 190 credits.
- The OBS821 coursework-related module, as a credit-bearing short course, contributes 20 credits towards the programme. The remaining credits consist of additional coursework-related modules (IBR821, IBR822, OBS821) and a research component (OBS892, NME804, RHP801, RHP804, NME815).
- Successful completion of the NQF level 9 short course allows candidates to receive 20 credits for the equivalent OBS821 module in the MPhil (IBR) programme.
- Completion of a relevant short course does not guarantee admission to the formal postgraduate programme, which has an independent selection process.
- Priority will be given to delegates meeting the articulation requirements during the selection process for the postgraduate programme.
- Only short courses offered by the Department of Business Management at the University of Pretoria are eligible for articulation.
- Impact of General Regulation G35 of UP which states as follows:

"G.35 ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF MODULES

If there is overlap in the course content of the degree for which the student wishes to enrol or is enrolled and a degree already conferred, the dean may not acknowledge any examinations and modules that form part of the degree already conferred.

Financial Implications for Articulation Pathways

- Articulation Fee Adjustment: Delegates electing to pursue the NQF level 9 credit-bearing module, with the intention of articulating these credits towards the MPhil in Insolvency & Business Rescue programme, will be subject to an additional fee. This fee is in recognition of the increased academic value, resource allocation, and administrative efforts required to facilitate the credit-bearing aspect of the module.
